Led by 6th President Fe Amor Ilagan in 1998-2000, 7th President Benedicta Martinez in 2000-2002, 8th President Ligaya Robles in 2002-2004, 9th President Guia Martinez in 2004-2006 and 10th current President Gloria Bernardo saw the eventual development of SICC into the most outstanding club for the past three years.

After almost perfecting our club's performance standing tall as one of the ten most outstanding clubs for sixteen years, getting grants, finalists in Soroptimist Celebrating Success and best practice awards from SI, we are now on the hall of flame. We are the Renaissance club in SIPR. We got an SIA Bowl for 26 new members in 2007. We also won first place for our Ginsaugon project teaching livelihood to women victims of the mudslide that buried 1,000 residents in 30-feet mudflow.

Our leadership also made waves here and abroad.

We thank God and bow our heads in humility as we share our service work to God and country.
